Our workshops and seminars are free, our consulting services are provided at a highly subsidized cost, and small fee is charged for long-term training.


The Business Development Center is partially funded by the U.S. Small Business Administration.

- 31% have gross income between \$26k - \$50k


Clients Served

Cumulative Since 1999




Impact On Business

Businesses Assisted




Impact On Jobs
